



# Domestic~Pet~Travel – Can I fly with my cat on American domestic flights?

Traveling with your feline companion can feel overwhelming especially when you want to ensure safety, comfort and compliance with airline policies. If you are asking “Can I fly with my cat on American domestic flights?” the direct answer is yes. American Air Lines allows cats to travel on most domestic routes within the Southwest States provided that specific guidelines are followed. Cats are typically permitted to fly in the cabin with their owners in an approved pet carrier that fits under the seat in front of you. There are fees, reservation limits, age requirements for pets and carrier specifications you must meet. Additionally, there may be seasonal restrictions and documentation requirements depending on your departure and arrival states. ## American Air Lines Domestic Pet Travel Policy Overview

When considering domestic pet travel American Air Lines provides a structured and pet-friendly framework for cat owners. American allows small cats to travel in the cabin on most domestic flights within the Southwest States. The pet must be able to fit comfortably inside an airline-approved soft or hard-sided carrier that can be stored underneath the seat directly in front of the passenger. The airline has a limited number of pet spots available per flight which means early reservation is highly recommended.

American Air Lines requires pet reservations to be made in advance because cabin space for animals is limited. Once your ticket is confirmed, you should immediately add your pet to the reservation. Approval is based on availability. Each passenger is typically allowed one pet carrier and that carrier counts as your carry-on item. This means you can bring a personal item but may not bring an additional full-size carry-on bag.

The airline also enforces minimum age requirements. For domestic travel, kittens must generally be at least 10 weeks old. This ensures the pet is physically mature enough to handle air travel stress. Health and vaccination status should be up to date, though specific vaccination proof requirements may vary by state.

## Cabin Travel Rules on American Air Lines for Cats

American Air Lines primarily permits cats to travel in the aircraft cabin rather than as checked cargo for most domestic journeys. Cabin travel is widely considered the safest and least stressful option because your cat remains close to you throughout the flight. However, there are strict requirements for carriers and seating placement.

Your cat must remain inside the carrier at all times while at the airport and onboard the aircraft. The carrier must be ventilated on multiple sides and must allow the pet to stand, turn around, and lie down comfortably. The carrier must fit fully under the seat in front of you. Because aircraft types vary, acceptable carrier dimensions may differ slightly depending on the specific plane operating your flight.

On American Air Lines domestic flights, pets are generally not permitted to occupy exit row seats, bulkhead rows without under-seat storage, or certain premium cabin seats that do not have adequate space underneath. If you are traveling in First Class, American Comfort+, or Main Cabin, you must verify under-seat space dimensions beforehand.

# Booking Process for Flying with Your Cat on American Air Lines

Booking a flight with your cat on American Air Lines requires additional planning compared to standard travel. After purchasing your ticket online or through a travel agent, you must contact American reservations to request a cabin pet space. Because each flight allows only a limited number of pets in the cabin, these spots can fill quickly, especially during holidays and peak travel seasons.

Once approved, American will annotate your booking to reflect the traveling pet. You will receive confirmation that your cat is authorized for cabin travel. Without this confirmation, you may be denied boarding with your pet.

It is recommended to confirm your pet reservation again 24 to 48 hours before departure. This ensures no administrative issues or system errors affect your booking. On travel day, you must check in at the airport counter rather than solely using mobile check-in, as American Air Lines personnel will visually verify the carrier and pet.

## American Air Lines Pet Carrier Requirements

Carrier compliance is one of the most critical aspects of flying domestically with your cat on American Air Lines. The carrier must be airline-approved and capable of fitting under the seat in front of you. Soft-sided carriers are often recommended because they offer slight flexibility in fitting under seats while still providing structure and ventilation.

Your cat must remain fully inside the carrier and the carrier door must be secured during taxi, takeoff, landing, and the entire duration of the flight. The airline will not permit you to remove your cat from the carrier while onboard.

Ventilation panels are required on multiple sides. The base should be leak-proof in case of accidents. It is advisable to line the interior with absorbent pads. Some travelers also add a familiar blanket to reduce stress.
